



The North Coast Division holds 10 events a year (none in July and August). Events are on the 2nd Friday of each month. A





GENERAL MEETING MINUTES

Friday September 14, 2018

Meeting called to order at 7:30 pm by Superintendent Lee Sheffield, who asked for any additions or corrections to the Minutes for the June 2018 meeting; none were received.

Treasurer Greg Noeth stated that we have \$39,283 in assets, with two of the three payments made to the Berea Fairboard for the Division's upcoming train show. We have received approximately seventy-five percent of the dealer money.

Lee introduced George Keller as the incoming Membership Chair. Current Membership Chair Bill Ferry gave a report of new members and asked for them and any visitors to introduce themselves. George Keller talked about his aims as Membership Chair.

Great Berea Train Show: Lee emphasized the need for additional volunteers, with a special need for two people at the back gate at all times. Comic-Con will also be taking place at the same time in adjacent building. Show Chair David James reported that dealer tables are essentially sold out and he is currently working through his wait list. Joe Kurilec MMR has done an outstanding job of distributing flyers in the Northeastern Ohio area. Additional flyers are available for placement. Volunteer wristbands will be distributed directly by Lee Sheffield and David James.

David James set up a portable PA system for use and review during the meeting as we are considering the purchase of such a system.

Larry Kuczynski has agreed to run the summer picnic.

Medina County Fair - 4H Modular Layout: Division members attending the fair voted on their favorite module. Megan West won for module set #2 (mountain), as voted on by 15 members attending the fair. A drawing was held during the meeting for those

in attendance- Fred Obreza won and received an HO scale engine.

Clinic Chair Larry Madson reported he would give his layout wiring clinic this evening. Next month will be given by Bruce Bowie on layout planning. November's clinic will be by Mike Cole on the Valley Railroad. Bram Bailey will present his clinic in January (details will be given later).

Module Committee Chair Scott Benson gave a report on the modular layout's display at the National Train Show in Kansas City, MO. Fifteen members of the group came to work and run trains, in conjunction with members and modules from the Hub Division. Scale Trains loaned an engine and was happy to have us "demo" it on the layout. Upcoming events are the Great Berea Train Show, Berea Library, Training Day, International Trees and Trains event, and one other event in the plans. Additional shows are being considered for next year and 2020. Scott said that we have been asked to display at the Cuyahoga County Fair in 2019, and he's received enough positive indication from the group that he is proceeding to make arrangements. Scott gave a brief description of T-Trak, indicating that some divisions within the Mid-Central Region have active T-Trak groups and that a T-Trak layout is planned for next year's regional convention. There will probably be a complete presentation at a future date.

Assistant Superintendent Ron Morgan gave a brief PowerPoint presentation of his experiences during the National Convention in Kansas City.

Achievement Program Chair Bruce Brintnall, MMR gave Jim Grell 2 merit awards and George Keller 2 merit awards. These awards were earned during this year's regional contest. Bruce then gave Ron Morgan his AP Electrical Certificate.

Contest Chair Dave Lawler announced that tonight's contest is billboard reefers. Next month's contest will

Training Day Chair Gary Schaefer reminded everyone that November 4 is Training Day and requested kit donation for building during the event.

Open House Chair Ron Morgan listed upcoming layout open houses on November 17 and 18.

The Awards Banquet will again be at Carrie Cerino's on our regular meeting night in December.

Dave Williams gave a brief overview of progress on next year's Regional Convention in Youngstown.

Company Store Chair Chuck Klein gave a description of the Store's current inventory. Chuck is interested in transitioning out of this position and is looking for interested persons.

Raffle Chair Adam Woodie talked about the evening's prizes with a theme of "Back to School".

George Keller gave a brief update on NKP engine 757's projected return to Bellevue. Final inspection and rolling "run" were successful. The Mad River and NKP Museum will use a recently acquired caboose as the required crew car. George projected an October or November time frame as probable for the movement. Lee Sheffield added that NKP 765 will be running in the Cuyahoga Valley the weekends of the 22nd and 29th.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:30 pm. 🚄

NMRA MCR Division 4 BOD Meeting held on Saturday August 25, 2018

The meeting was called to order by Superintendent Lee Sheffield at 10:10 am.

In attendance were: Lee Sheffield, Ron Morgan, Greg Noeth, Dave Williams, Brian Haas, Jim Moore, Fred Obreza, Jeff Lauren, Joe Kurilec MMR, Larry Madson, Bruce Bowie, Steve Kaplan, Chuck Klein, Ben Lanza, and Adam Woodie.

Lee thanked Jim Moore and Bruce Bowie for arranging the meeting location.

The upcoming Great Berea Train Show was discussed. Lee emphasized the need to have the gates fully staffed as we will again be sharing the Fairgrounds with Comic Con. David James provided additional Train Show details, indicating that marketing for the show is currently going strongly. There will be a meeting at David's house on September 10, 2018 for status and planning. David said that he is currently working through all of the paperwork. A cookout is planned for volunteers after the show (on Saturday - Editor). Joe Kurilec MMR indicated that show flyers will be available at the September General Meeting for distribution to area locations.

Lee stated that George Keller had assumed responsibilities for the Membership Committee.

Chuck Klein presented a report for the Company Store, giving the status of status and inventory of the Davies Steel Car project, and Division shirts. Chuck is looking to transition out of his position. Bruce Bowie stated that he would post an announcement in the Flatwheel.

It was decided to postpone consideration of any field trips at least until Spring 2019.

Joe Kurilec MMR has been working with local area hobby

shops to encourage them to provide NMRA discounts with good results.

A discussion was held about the possibility of using a portable PA system for the General Meetings. Issues concerning transport and storage were discussed but not resolved. David James said that he is caring for another organization's system and that he would be bring it to an upcoming meeting for evaluation before the Division makes any decision to purchase such a system.

A motion was made by Bruce Bowie and seconded by Brian Haas to reimburse the Modular Group for fuel expenses incurred during the modules transport to and from the 2018 National Train Show in Kansas City, MO. David James (driver) provided the amount. The motion passed unanimously. A replacement for the modular group's trailer (in this year's budget) is actively being sought.

Lee introduced discussion of the upcoming season's calendar (September 2018 through August 2019). The dates were provided on a handout. No conflicts were identified. The Awards Banquet is scheduled to take place again at Carrie Cerino's on December 14, 2018.

Flatwheel editor Bruce Bowie thanked everyone for the articles and photos received throughout the summer for the September issue.

The 4H Model Railroading Group's modular display at the Medina County Fair was discussed, along with the need for advisors at their meetings.

A representative of the meeting host Erie Metro Live Steamers thanked us for choosing their location for the BOD meeting and gave a brief status of the facility. We were told that we are always welcome.


Make a Difference Hall of Honor

He is the owner of Hawks Nest Art Studio which creates and ships wheel thrown ceramics through-out our country. Eastern Europe and China. During his tenure at Midview, he served as the Fine Art and Music Department Chair, District Coordinator for Music and Art Programs, and Student Council Advisor. Filipiak also taught ceramics at Lorain County Community College where he designed the Stocker Center Ceramics and Sculpture labs. He also worked as an art teacher for the Elyria School System. Filipiak, a train enthusiast, worked to obtain the railroad caboose and railroad tower in Grafion from CSX Corp. He worked to coordinate the moving and restoration of both. For his work, he received a Right Track Award for Outstanding Clazen from the Grafton Midview Business Association. Union Pacific Is Rebuilding Its Largest Steam Locomotive

'Big Boy' 4014 is being restored to celebrate the 150th anniversary of the Transcontinental Railroad.

The Union Pacific Railroad is restoring one of its last remaining steam engines, one of the largest in the world, to celebrate the 150th anniversary of the completion of the Transcontinental Railroad, reports Atlas Obscura.

Unlike the steam engines that head-on met Promontory, Utah in 1869 when the Transcontinental Railroad was completed, the Big Boys were built in the 1940s and were among the last steam engines in use. They were built to address the need for more power to pull long trains over the mountains. Multiple locomotives were usually used, but each locomotive required its own crew and more fuel. The Big Boy was designed to have enough handle these power to

mountain passes all by itself.

The Big Boys operated from 1941 through 1959 when they were replaced with diesel-electric locomotives. Most of the huge steam engines were scrapped, but eight were spared and put on display in museums around the country. In 2013, Union Pacific announced that it would be restoring Big Boy 4014 with the intention of having it ready by May 10, 2019, the 150th anniversary of the completion of the Transcontinental Railroad.

Union Pacific 4014 is an appropriately named "Big Boy" locomotive. It is 132 feet, 9 inches long, and weighs over one million pounds. It has two sets of eight drive wheels, plus two sets of four wheels in front and behind them. When U.P. 4014 makes its trip to Utah next year it will be the first time it has run in 60 years.



Owner Matt Porter showed me around and stated that he wanted to get more model railroading supplies in the store.








There is a good supply of items we all can use for our layouts. Haven Raceway & Hobby had a very good supply of tools and masking tape.

TRACK MISHAP AT WEST THIRD

Recently I needed to get to the old B&O roundhouse at the Clark Avenue Yards to ask a few questions. I got more then expected!

The information below is verbal and there could be some errors.

Last night, Monday, 8-20-18 a CSX crew was moving several gondolas full of VERY HEAVY scrap metal. This was being moved on the CSX between steel mills which I was told was somewhat odd.

The track they were on is an interchange track between two yards. The weight from the cars and the poor condition of the track in this area caused the rail to spread, tipping over sideways, pulling the rail from the spikes!

Watching the crew move the bent and somewhat twisted rail was something to see.

An interesting piece of information I learned is NKP 2-8-4, 765 will be on this track in September 2018 for the excursions in the Cuyahoga Valley. The CV will pick up the Berk and take it to the shops by the scenic railroad.

There was some concern about that move and the poor condition of the tracks which could cause problems for the steamer.



As the heavy rail was removed the crew added new ties. While the crew was very safety minded, you understand just how dangerous running a railroad is!



The crew mentioned that the new rail would be a straight thru section removing a crossover. Knowing the weight of the rails and the force needed to cause this is amazing.



A day later the rails were repaired, ballasted and old bent rails removed






