


















APRIL MEETING CLINIC INTRO OF PRESENTER JOE FILIPIAK — "LET'S GET REAL"






Part 10 ended looking at the tipple on Eastland Road by the old Berea Brick Company. We will now go across Eastland Road and take a quick look at the brick yard.

The Berea Brick yard was located over an area that had a very good clay that was perfect for "burning" in the brick making process. The plant was built sometime before 1900. At that time they made tiles for farmers. Berea Brick closed in 1948 as concrete block had taken over the building market. One of the kiln was left to be saved but that never happened.



Looking to the center left, you can see Eastland Road. Across Eastland Road, center right was the tipple. Looking at photos I found there were trucks loaded with finished brick for shipment. Photo Berea Historical Society.




There was a rail spur not connected to the railroad. They used small carts to bring in materials. I am guessing that some of the trucks at the brick yard were used to bring coal from the tipple to fire the kilns.





ABOUT US

We are Division 4 of the Mid-Central Region of the National Model Railroad Association. (DIV-4 MCR NMRA).

With more than 200 members from Cuyahoga, Erie, Huron, Lorain and Medina counties in the state of Ohio.

The North Coast Division meetings are normally held on the second Friday of the month, to hear guest speakers, share skills, have railroad related clinics, and to share common problems and successes. Many of us get together informally in round-robin sessions to operate and work on each other's layouts, or just talk railroads and modeling.



The Detroit & Toledo Shore Line served industries in and between its namesake cities starting in 1903. The Shore Line supplied a lot of traffic to the Clever Leaf/NKP/N&W and the Grand Trunk Western, who each held a 50% stake. Here a caboose with an unorthodox window configuration is coupled to an SW9 carrying the same number in Toledo. Thirty-six days later, the GTW would buy out the N&W, and the DTS would cease to exist.
