The North Coast Division holds 10 meetings a year (none in July and August). Meetings are on the **2nd Friday of each**



Golden Spike Work Session

It's not too late to join! Even if you have built many craftsman style or detailed commercial kits, sign up to share your knowledge and enjoy a day of model building.

The Golden Spike Award is the gateway to the NMRA Achievement Program. One qualification for the Golden Spike is to display six units of rolling stock from either scratchbuilt, craftsman kits or superdetailed commercial kits. Rolling stock includes both motive power and cars, freight, passenger or MoW. While a 'shake the box' kit on its own doesn't meet the criteria, it can form the basis for a piece of rolling stock that does. Detailed commercial kits such as Proto2000, InterMountain, Red Caboose, Branchline kits and other craftsman kits do qualify.

The Division has reserved a meeting room at the Strongsville branch of the Cuyahoga County Public Library on Saturday, October 25th. The library opens at 9:00 am with the work session beginning at 9:30. We are limiting the number of participants to 15 members. There is no cost to attend other than to cover supplies, if needed.

After a short presentation, we will work on rolling stock kits that will qualify for the Golden Spike Award. Members should bring the following:

A detailed commercial kit, as mentioned above

- Tools for assembling the kit
- Hobby knife with a #11 blade
- Cutting mat
- Liquid solvent cement (Tamiya, Testors, etc.)
- Microbrushes
- Tweezers
- Hobby files
- Hobby screwdrivers
- Magnifier (if needed)

If you don't already have a detailed commercial kit in your stash, the Great Berea Train Show is an opportunity to find one, or more, to work on. Look for Intermountain boxcars,

Proto2000 boxcars or covered hoppers etc. If you are unable to located a kit, we can provide one with advance notice.

We will also go over how to upgrade a 'shake the box' kit to have it qualify for the Golden Spike Award.

If you have additional kits to work on, bring them with you. We have reserved the meeting room until 4:30 pm. We will take a break for lunch.

Future work sessions will include a hands-on weathering clinic, taking the car(s) and weathering them using various weathering techniques and materials; scenery; constructing structure kits to qualify for the Golden Spike Award. Almost all the requirements for the Golden Spike Award can be satisfied building 2'x4' module. This is an excellent opportunity to achieve the Golden Spike Award, join the Div 4 module group and have more fun. Fall Layout Tours

Bruce Bowie on East Broad Top......Under Construction -- HO

My Work Crew(Gary Dunn, Chris Boyd, Jeff Gray, Fred Wagner, Steve Kelly) have provided skills and inspiration to get the EBT v3.2 well along the way. Mainline track is (8/2025) complete including handlaid curved, dual gauge and stub turnouts. Scenery is 70% complete and what is complete is amazing. I am using steel "2x4's" and polyiso foam for the main structure.

The layout is two level with a helix to travel between levels and includes several unique features. The peninsula uses "mushroom" construction to allow operations on both sides. The layout is designed for operations. It is a proto-freelanced design of the narrow gauge East Broad.

John Hemsath on Bay Lines II

The layout was open last October; four months into its construction. The benchwork, which is complete, is L-girder supported on brackets attached to the wall so there are no legs. Now 90% of the track is laid and most of the structures are on the layout. A few of the structures from the old layout in Bay Village have been reconstructed to fit their new space. Several new structures are on the layout as well. Scenery has begun as has track ballasting. Several operating sessions have been run so it's finally a working layout running on wireless NCE DCC.

The setting is an industrial Midwest area in September of 1946. For an operating session we'll use either all steam or early diesels.

Please park in the driveway or on the opposite side of the street. Enter through the front door.

Chuck Shick......Under Construction – HO

Entire layout work has been done by myself, with helpful comments from Ron Spiga, and some detail parts were provided by Joe Kurilec.

This is mostly a single track, single level layout and is completely freelanced. The layout is designed for Operations, and has only a little scenery done.

The Layout is DCC currently using NCE wired throttles.

The layout is in the basement and is not handicap accessible. There is a handrail for the steps. Parking in Driveway, or on same side of street. Enter through Side Door and go down stairs.

Never Operated?

Years ago, I was invited to an operating session at the home of the late Harold Taylor. I had never participated in an op session before and I was very nervous that I might screw things up and embarrass myself. I need not have worried. I was among friends who were all there to have fun. That night changed the way I approached model railroading. I converted my layout, then under construction, to a switching layout, hosted operating sessions, and found I had more fun sharing my layout than I could have had as a lone wolf.

Now, I want to give that experience I had to those of you who have never operated on a layout with car cards, etc. Here's a chance to find out what operations are like and to see if you like it or not. And mine is a very simple, small layout. No timetable, no signals, no hidden storage tracks, not even any switch machines! I use wireless throttles. No worries about block control or cables. There are three switching areas, and each is electrically isolated so if one operator has a derailment and a short, it has no effect on anybody else.

Each operator takes a 4-car train out of the yard to his work area, does the switching and returns to the yard with a 4-car train. I use car cards by Mico Mark to tell you where each car goes, and you work at your own pace.






