Editor's Notes

I keep running into some confusion concerning the mailing of the Flatwheel, and I guess it's obviously because I haven't said much on the subject, so here are a few facts. My wife Julie – incidentally a member of the NMRA – proofreads each issue, then takes each copy (one at a time from each batch of fifty that I print) and: checks for the right number of pages in the correct order, staples the pages together, folds the Flatwheel in half, rolls it flat with a veneer roller (it makes the whole house rattle), places a seal to hold the folded pages together, places a stamp on the Flatwheel, then places your mailing label on. She then places the Flatwheel into a mailing tray, periodically wrapping 25 or so with a rubber band. She also gives me a running count of the number left that I need to print. The new printer has greatly reduced the number of misprints (blank pages or some really bizarre page sequences) but they still occur. Once she's completed loading the tray with all the Flatwheels, I take them to the post office the next day (usually Stow – they're close to my work and very reliable). As you can see, rumors that we use a printing service, or someone else mails the Flatwheel, or even that somehow I do it all myself, are greatly exaggerated! We do appreciate all of you that have taken yourselves off the US Mailing list and receive an email each month to view online (in addition to appreciating the \$10 or more that you save the Division per year).

Tenax Glue – I always assume that I'm the last to catch on to things but I've talked to a few people recently who are where I was before I learned about Tenax Plastic Cement at a *Modeling with the Masters* workshop. The directions on the bottle are correct but after fifty years of gluing plastic together, who reads the directions? When I first tried Tenax, I put a brushful of the stuff onto one piece and then put the first piece onto the second. Nothing happened. I kept trying with the same result (doing the same thing and expecting a different result may be a sign of insanity but it does work sometimes with computers). I went back to Parma Hobby and bought a second bottle, assuming my first was defective. Same result, so then assumed that their whole batch was bad- with a nagging suspicion that I didn't know what I was doing. I went back to my Testor's assortment until Miles Hale demonstrated what the bottle said – have the pieces together and *then* touch/brush it on. It apparently evaporates too quickly for the old put-it-on-one-piece-only routine. Both my "defective" bottles have worked just fine ever since. It sets up very quickly and doesn't seem to melt details when I use my closeness counts technique – just leaves a shiny surface where it's slopped onto (that is, applied to) a visible surface – hopefully to be obscured by painting but I haven't reached that point yet. Next - a sure fire method of determining which end of an airbrush the paint usually comes out of. Wear safety glasses and an old shirt if you want to follow along.


