I recommend to anyone contemplating building a model railroad to read his idea of "givens and druthers" to help you solidify the kind of railroad you want. If your interest includes operation of the railroad, then continuing the planning process should include an important read of John Armstrong's Track Planning for Realistic Operation. This book was not an easy read for me. Some sections I had to read three or four times to understand. In defense of Armstrong, some of what he is teaching is rather complex, but will help you in the design of your railroad. Finally, a review of his "square square" method of dealing with curves will be helpful in configuring your track plan. At this point you will have learned a lot and haven't drawn a track plan yet. But you are getting close. Next month I'll go into some specific things I wanted to incorporate into my railroad (which is an expansion of the "givens and druthers").

On a different note, I would like to express to each of you my gratitude for making Division 4 a strong and vibrant Division. To your credit we have outstanding layouts, a strong modular group with a robust display schedule, a strong membership outreach program, a group of modelers actively building new layouts, a group of modelers actively operating their layouts, a group of modelers who have exhibited fantastic and improving modeling skills in the areas of rail equipment, scenery, and structure building, and a large group of enthusiastic modelers who are sharing their knowledge and skills with a public that is wanting to know more about what we do and how do it.

#### **Editor's Notes**

One of the more pleasant parts of my stint as Modeling Coordinator for the Nickel Plate Society was meeting contest entrants like Eric and Martha Newberry during the annual conventions. Martha had a razor sharp mind that she applied to both her models and her conversation. She scratchbuilt a depot (it may not have actually been Nickel Plate, but trust me, with her level of craftsmanship, it was still unanimously welcomed onto the contest table) and what caught my eye was a red pencil on a desk in the fully detailed interior. To be able to convincingly craft an HO scale pencil is amazing, but additionally consider knowing exactly where to place the pencil for the best effect, and for that matter, that the pencil was necessary to create a more realistic composition was truly astounding. I was lucky enough to sit with Martha in this year's Regional contest room (there seemed to be an informal waiting line of her fans). She mentioned that she'd had some recent health problems that would probably limit her modeling ability, and we both got quiet for a few seconds. I spent the time pondering the inevitable aging process and assumed that she was doing the same. Nope - she'd taken those few seconds to glance at the scoresheet for her entry, recalculating probably faster than the original judge - and more correctly. She motioned a judge over in a split second and got her full points. Martha was a professional modeler and a wonderful person, and I'll miss seeing her.

On a lighter subject, I'm trying to puzzle my way through Iain Rice's book, *Layout Design*. You're probably familiar with his writing in *Model Railroader* magazine, but this is very different. It's obviously aimed at a British audience, with numerous references to obscure locations and scales. 2mm, 4mm? I kind of get OO. Nevertheless, the parts of what he says that translate into American make the book worth the effort. Like Art, I've had some trouble with understanding all of John Armstrong, and this book makes it all a little easier. Besides, Mr Rice has a good sense of humor - stating (on lighting) that many layouts seem to be sited on a strange planet with many suns and a surface temperature that could "happily melt lead"! 
