#### Editor's Notes

For the 3rd month in a row, I was out-of-town during "Flatwheel weekend", and for the 2nd month in a row, had poor Internet service, so sorry once again if I left out a report or announcement. This time it was the North Central Region's convention in Fort Wayne Indiana. If that was an indication of how they put on a convention, you need to sign up for the 2016 Indianapolis National right away (I already have). They had lots of prototype tours, a lot of really great clinics, and some good layouts for both visiting and operating. Everyone was very friendly. The Hotel Fort Wayne seems to be THE destination for a lot of rail conventions (NKPHTS some years back). It may be a little past its prime but they take really good care of their visitors. Most clinics went very smoothly except that the projectors seemed to be having trouble with Windows 10 - the projectors would shut down mid-presentation as if they'd entered sleep mode and restoration was not quick or easy. Every clinic started on time to the minute except one. That clinician showed up early and suddenly realized that he'd left something at home. He came back about half an hour past start time. Then he noticed that someone hadn't brought everything in from his car. Then he couldn't get the computer to work. Finally, he couldn't get the projector to work (and never did). His first words to us? "I model the Penn Central." That didn't seem to surprise anyone. He also later described himself as a perfectionist. He was referring to his models, so that may have been an accurate statement in that context. Interestingly, this guy had some very unique approaches to what he was doing, so he still wound up with nearly full points for his presentation. Another clinic was on 3D printing. Several months ago I mentioned that was planning to buy a 3D printer. Frank Bongiovanni pointed out that the cost of the filament is still on the high side and that I should check into www.shapeways.com for their printing service instead. I did defer buying the printer on that advice and I'm glad - the clinic presenter only uses Shapeways for his work and said that to get their quality would take at least a \$20,000 used printer.

I visited Keeneland Racetrack during the MCR convention and returned last month for a day of their limited racing schedule. On the way back the next day, I stopped by the town of Canal Winchester just east of Columbus to see the one room schoolhouse that is the basis of the current MCR structure project. It's been moved to a small park and is adjacent to the town's depot in its original location. It's also next to a grain elevator that still contains some of the mechanism used to lift wagons (and maybe trucks) to dump grain. Being a weekday, none of the buildings were open, so I'm hoping to go back (maybe on a tour) during next year's Regional Convention in Columbus.

In the latest *NMRA Magazine*, a recipient of the NMRA's Honorary Life Member award is credited with earning that achievement through his work with Brian Barnt. Does that make Brian an extra-honorary life member?


